Calling all Explorer Scouts working as Young Leaders in Greater London South East.....

The Young Leader Scheme is here! My name is Paul Amass and together with Danny Southby we will be running this years Young Leaders Training Scheme.

When?

7.30pm Friday 8th March - 5.30pm Sunday - 10th March 2019

Where?

At Great Oaks, Wilberforce Scout Camp, Keston, Kent.

Who can go?

Anyone between the ages of fourteen and eighteen in the Districts of Bexley and Bromley who is a young person working with a section in a Scout Group. (If you are over eighteen at the time of the course you cannot attend as you are classed as an adult).

What's on offer?

Except for Module K First Aid, which is explained later, we will be running the entire Young Leader Scheme modules. They are:

- Module A - Prepare for take-off!
- Module B - Taking the lead
- Module C - That's the way to do it!
- Module D - Understanding Behaviour
- Module E - Game on!
- Module F - Making Scouting accessible
- Module G - Programme plans
- Module H - Programme plans plus
- Module I - What did they say?

Why can't I do Module K First Aid as well?

This is because it is a stand-alone course that lasts a day. You will gain the Emergency First Aid at work qualification, the same as an adult leader. We are running two courses and the places are allocated on a first come first served basis, you will get to indicate your preference when you sign up. so you can attend the closest one to you or the day that suits you. If you already hold this certificate, you will not have to complete the First Aid Course again.

- 16th March - 5th Beckenham South HQ - 12 places
- 24th March - 1st North Cray - 24 places

What's the idea of the modules?

They are designed to support your personal development as a young person who helps with a younger section and enable you as a Young Leader to work effectively in the section you choose. Remember this is a training course, and we try to deliver the majority of Learning through activities, games and having fun in a relaxed, friendly way.

Have we got to learn all weekend?

NO! We intend to have a combination of Scout Activities, Wide Games, Team Building Games, etc in between sessions.

How much?

The First Aid course and the weekend are FREE to all Young Leaders. However, we request a deposit of £25 to be paid. This will be returned to you after you have attended the YL weekend and your scheduled first aid training day. However it will not be returned if you withdraw from the course. This deposit is paid because Young Leaders have been known to say yes in the past and not turn up after we have organised accommodation, food, and activities and booked a First Aid Training - which is quite a substantial sum beforehand and blocks others from signing up.

After the weekend is that it?

No! As well as your First Aid course (if you haven't completed it before the weekend), you will need to complete four projects to validate the modules or put into practice what you have learnt. This will be explained on the training weekend.

How do I get a place on the course?

Note: The medical profession takes the view that the parent's consent to medical treatment cannot be delegated. This view is explicit in the Children Act 1989. Thus medical consent forms have no legal status and a doctor/nurse insisting on the consent of a parent to a particular treatment has the right to do so. For this reason we do not recommend that Leaders insist on parents signing the statement above. However, it can be a comfort to medical staff to have general consent in advance from parents or to have a Leader on hand able to sign forms required by medical authorities
